WHAT'S ON YOUR READING LIST?

Stephanie and I enjoyed a wonderful trip to the Pacific Northwest in early July. We toured the western edge of the Cascades, walked the beach along the Pacific coast, ferried around Puget Sound, visited a few hot spots in Seattle, and caught up with several old friends. We also flew to Kansas City for a couple of days, where Stephanie spoke at a professional conference.

All this sightseeing and friend reconnecting was delightful. The double bonus was having time to catch up on my reading. True confessions: which books to pack for a trip is a harder question for me than what clothes to take. Books are heavy. Airlines are strict. Nobody wants to be stuck with a bad book on a long flight.

My reading list for the trip was pretty eclectic, including *Every Last One*, Anna Quindlen's new novel; *The Supreme Court*, a series of interviews by C-Span journalists; *Shaping New Leaders*, a new piece on mentoring seminarians; *Methland*, a narrative study of the explosion of methamphetamine abuse in rural America; *The Great Emergence*, a kind of "Cliff's Notes" version of Christian history, complete with an analysis of the current upheaval in North American Christianity, and a somewhat hopeful forecast for the future.

Given my love for reading, I was pleased to be greeted upon my return to Eden by a display in the narthex featuring summer reading suggestions from our library. Our church library is not huge, but our librarians, Alliene Turner and Marilyn Sundberg, her predecessor, have diligently culled and collected books that reflect the interests of Eden's inquiring laity.

One does not need a seminary diploma to enjoy Eden's collection. Check it out. Add a book from the church library to your summer reading list. And let me know what you find helpful, challenging, or even troubling. I'm interested in what you're reading, too.

Spirit-In-Action

A Special Message to the Eden UCC Community

As many of you know, the past year has been one of profound financial challenge for FESCO. With dramatic losses in government contract funding, it was unclear how or even whether FESCO would survive. We decided to let the entire community that supports FESCO know that we needed help and ask for their support.

The response has been overwhelming. Everyone has done what they can and that, combined with some program changes, has ensured our survival. Few have done more than the Eden UCC community. Your Intergenerational Choir held a benefit concert for us. Shortly after that, you put on the annual Christmas luncheon to benefit FESCO. The Board of Trustees took our circumstances into consideration when determining our occupancy costs. The Eden Area Foundation provided special support when it learned of our situation. Pastor Arlene was generous with advice, ideas, and referrals. Above all, so many of you as individuals responded generously to our Challenge Fund Campaign. As of the end of May, community support for FESCO was up 70% over the prior year.

Because of your support, we have been able to continue moving families beyond homelessness in spite of the enormous barriers created by the recession. FESCO has survived, and with your continued support, we can and will end family homelessness in our community. Thank you so much for your generosity of treasure and of spirit.

FESCO is once again gearing up for the school year by providing their current clients and alumni students with backpacks filled with school supplies. Last year FESCO distributed 237 backpacks; 51 of them were for college-bound students. This year FESCO is looking for spiral notebooks, binder paper, pencil boxes, pencil pouches, scissors (sharp), pencil sharpeners, Scotch tape, staplers, glue, composition books, marking pen sets, colored pencil sets, ballpoint pens, erasers, rulers, calculators, assignment pads, binders (hard cover), binder dividers/pockets, paperback dictionaries, highlighters, crayons, and backpacks (no red or blue). To donate your backpacks or supplies, bring them to the church office during the week or to church on Sunday. The last day to donate is Sunday, **Aug. 15**.

Herman Barahona has been involved in community organizing for almost ten years. After college graduation, he trained as a community organizer at Saul Alinsky's Industrial Areas Foundation with its Southwest sister organizations led by Ernesto Cortes. After a couple of years of learning the craft, he began working independently and organized leadership clusters in highly distressed areas throughout Los Angeles County. He has worked with a broad base of community leaders, institutional leaders, and public officials interested in building power to create strategies that improve public education, public safety, public health, and the conditions that affect immigrants.

As a new arrival to the San Francisco Bay area, he has had the opportunity to work with Catholic Charities of the East Bay and served on the Board of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development – a fund dedicated to funding social justice campaigns in the

Oakland Diocese. He has joined COR of the PICO network and will be working with the Hayward and Ashland/Cherryland communities. In partnership with his wife Desiree, Herman is glad to be in the Bay area to continue to learn and invest in families.

PACS Features Metropolitan Opera Star

The next recital in the Performing Arts Series will be held Sunday, **Sept. 19**, at 3 p.m., and will feature soprano Marie Plette, renowned in the major opera houses of North America and Europe for her compelling portrayals from Cio-Cio San in *Madame Butterfly* to Love Simpson in *Cold Sassy Tree* and the Countess in *Le Nozze di Figaro*. Her recent performances of *Madame Butterfly* prompted the *New York Times* to remark, "The opera did partake of the other unifying factor here: a star turn, by Marie Plette in the title role." Immediately after winning the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions in 1992, Ms. Plette was invited to make her Metropolitan Opera debut as the First Lady in *Die Zauberflöte*. She has performed frequently with the company since then in roles including Donna Elvira in *Don Giovanni*, Guttrune in *Götterdämmerung*, and Kristina in the *Makropulos Case*. Some of her past season highlights included performances in the title role *Iphigenia in Tauris* with Seattle Opera; Larina in *Eugene Onegin* with Lyric Opera of Chicago; the title role in *Tosca* with Sacramento Opera; and Cio-Cio San in *Madame Butterfly* with San Francisco Opera, Sacramento Opera, and Michigan Opera Theatre.
