

Goal #1- Reduce youth violence by investing in youth in Cherryland

Activities and Outcomes:

- Youth Investment: <u>Cherryland Elementary Adopt-A-School Program</u> (2011-present)
 - Advocated for the ACCFB Mobile Food Pantry at Cherryland Elementary (winter 2013). Volunteers from Eden Church help out at the mobile food pantry distributions.
 - Comida para Cherryland-
 - Free Backpack & Supplies Program. Gave out 100 backpacks and supplies in Fall 2011, 110 backpacks in Aug 2013, and 142 in Aug 2014.
 - Held free book giveaways twice per year
 - o Advocated for an updated **volunteer and visitor policy** that allows all families to participate in their child's school. As a result, HUSD started a visitor pilot program at Cherryland Elementary in 2014.
 - Supported parent organizing around & passage of Measure L (November 2014). This will bring more resources to HUSD to build new school facilities and repair current infrastructures. Cherryland will get a new elementary & middle school in the neighborhood.
 - o Participated in Cherryland **PT(C)A** Meetings (Aug 2011-2014)
 - Attended Open House (Sept 2012, 2013, 2014)
 - Organized and hosted HUSD Board of Trustees Candidates' Forum with Cherryland Leaders (Oct 2012 &2014).

Goal #1 Reduce youth violence by investing in youth in Cherryland

Activities and Outcomes (cont.):

- Youth Investment: <u>Improve Food Security</u>
 - Established and developed Comida para Cherryland
 - Provide emergency food assistance for av. 200 families per month
 - Provide healthy snacks for food pantry participants
 - Provide information on other local food distributions, health clinics and social services help in area
 - Established partnership w/ "Let's Do Lunch" (May 2012-present)
 - Organized Cherryland Parents leadership of "Let's Do Lunch, Cherryland" (Summer 2012-2014), serving over 3,000 free lunches in Cherryland Park
 - Translate, update, and distribute, on an ongoing basis, the Hayward Food & Services Guide (Aug 2012-present)
 - Youth Investment: Cherryland Youth Leadership Institute (ChYLI) (Sum. 2012-2014)
 - o Enrolled **10 Cherryland** & Eden Area youth
 - o Integrated youth leaders into the operation of Comida para Cherryland
 - o **Established relationship** with college, community and business professionals

Goal #2- Contribute to economic development in Cherryland

Activities and Outcomes:

- 2014 Cherryland Youth Leadership Institute, 3rd summer, 10 youth who visited the Cal State East Bay and Chabot College campuses and attended a youth event at REACH Youth Center. The group developed personal resumes, researched career goals, created personal presentation that included still shots. The group also participated in community meetings and volunteer opportunities
- Advocated for and won HUSD "Measure L" (Nov 2014). The passage of the Measure L Bond will bring in more resources to HUSD and provide new elementary and middle school campus in Cherryland.

Goal # 3- Advocate for state and federal immigration policy reform

Activities and Outcomes:

- Helped Cherryland youth find legal representation and file **Deferred** Action applications (Summer 2012-present)
- Conducted HUSD BOT Candidates' Forum with 100 people in attendance (Oct 2014)
- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) Presentation (Dec 2013) and Application Workshop (Feb 2014).
- Held Immigration Workshop (March 2014) and had over 100 people in attendance and had a follow-up Attorney Consultation Workshop (April 2014) around issues of Housing, Employment and Immigration concerns.
- Participate in South County Unaccompanied Minors and Migrant Families Collaborative (Oct 2014-present). The top priority is to help unaccompanied children and families avoid deportation by setting up legal representation for them in their removal proceedings, affirmative asylum petitions, and special immigrant juvenile status (SIJS) claims. We will do this by fundraising for legal support (Centro Legal de La Raza & Catholic Charities EB) for those living in South Alameda County.

Goal #4- Create and implement cultural integration opportunities in our church and wider community

Outcomes:

- Increased understanding of cultural differences with congregation and neighboring communities
- Increased attendance of community member and church congregation to Compañeras/os activities.
- Increased number of new attendance at Sunday Service due to our Compañeras program.

Dia de Los Reyes Magos January 5, 2014

- Through "Happy Birthday, Jesus" children's gifts were collected and we received 200 gifts from the Alameda County Firefighters
- Through the Poinsettia Offering \$900 funds were raised for the Comida
- Youth and adults from Eden Church, Cherryland Community, Chabot College, and HHS wrapped gifts
- 15 Cherryland families and Eden leaders planned and hosted the party featuring traditional Mexican food, games, and prizes
- Every participating child between 0-12 received a free gift from Los Reyes Magos

Goal #5- Promote community and public health partnerships

Activities:

- Advocated for a FQHC at HHS, (2012-present)
- Sent letters of support for <u>TVHC's</u> proposed clinic in Ashland-Cherryland (TVHC) and participated in ground breaking and dedication ceremonies (2011-2014)
- Hosted VSP Vision Clinic at Cherryland Elementary (Sept 2013)
- Dispensing VSP vouchers to persons in need of optometry services (Aug 2012-present)
- Advocated for VSP Vision Clinic at Cherryland School Health Fair (Mar 28, 2013)
- Held sign-ups at Eden Church for Deputy Sherriff Activities League for soccer (DSAL)

Outcomes:

- The TVHC proposal was approved Jan 2013 & opened May 2014.
- 100+ vision screenings were conducted and 36 children and adults received eye glasses as a result of hosting the VSP Vision Clinic (Sept 2013)
- Comida para Cherryland-in April 2012 we have served an average of 40 families groceries twice a month. As of May 2014, we now serve an average of 100 families per food pantry.
- Arranged for VSP Vision Clinic @ Cherryland School Health Fair (Mar 28, 2013) and on VSP
 Vision Clinic @ Cherryland School on Sept 27, 2014. Saw 50 clients and gave away 10 vouchers.
- Organized a Free Flu Clinic, in partnership with Eden Medical Center, held at Comida para Cherryland on Nov 13,2013. Provided 87 families with free flu vaccines.

Outcomes (cont.):

Community work in Cherryland

- Seen and sought ought as a bridge among cultures and neighborhoods
- Seen and respected as a catalyst for community projects that make a difference
- New people are attending our church and community events, because they are excited about our community involvement
- Long-time members and **leaders are supporting** this effort
- New leaders are emerging to guide these ministries
- Newsletter, website and events have increased visibility of Eden Church's work.

Hayward High School Design Team

- Participants reflect a very diverse group of stakeholders
- Community members and parents who have never been involved at HHS and who haven't
 worked together before are now participating in this project and working together
- The number of health services for HHS has doubled and the COST structure was establishment for referrals and intake of students, since the DT became involved.
- TVHC Mobile Van will begin serving Hayward High School 2x a week (Jan 2015)

Cherryland Elementary School

- Developed a **great relationship** with the children, parents, staff, faculty, and administration.
- Earned the trust of School leaders that people in the community care about their school.
- We are invited and expected at all school events and meetings.
