You do not need to be a citizen to receive Medi-Cal benefits. Many California residents who are not U.S. citizens are eligible for Medi-Cal. Groups covered by Medi-Cal include:

- Families receiving CalWORKs (formerly AFDC)
- Low-income families who choose not to receive CalWORKs
- Families leaving CalWORKs due to earnings or receipt of child support
- Pregnant women
- Children in low income families
- People who are disabled, aged (65 years or older) or blind
- Many different types of immigrants
